What is LINK in Cornwall?

- The job of LINK in Cornwall is to listen to the views of people about their local health and social care services.
- LINK will work with the people who plan and run these services to make changes and improve them.
- LINK will ask and encourage people and organisations to be a part of LINK in Cornwall.

What will LINK in Cornwall do?

- LINK will find out more about the health issues that people in Cornwall are concerned about.
- LINK will find out more about the social care issues that people in Cornwall are concerned about.
- LINK will talk to professionals about these issues and ask them questions.
- LINK will go and visit places where care is provided to see how they are run.
- LINK will make sure that it is listened to.

How can I be a part of LINK?

You can be a part of LINK in a number of different ways:

- You can say what you think of health and social care services in Cornwall. Good and bad.
- You can come along to LINK meetings.
- You can receive the LINK newsletter and any other information LINK sends out.
- You can help decide on what activities LINK will need to do.
- You can join in with LINK activities.
- You can help other people be a part of LINK.
